INTRODUCTION

The National Women's Month Celebration has its roots in the recognition of International Women's Day (IWD) on March 8th, a historical event stemming from the organizing efforts of women in the early 20th Century. Between 1909 and 1911, working women in the United States, united under the National Women's Trade Union League and other groups, protested against low wages, lack of protective legislation, and harsh working conditions.

In the Philippines, the National Women's Month Celebration has become a platform to spotlight women's accomplishments and address ongoing and emerging issues related to women's empowerment and gender equality. The focus is on concrete activities aligned with national and international agreements, including the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women, the Beijing Platform for Action, the Philippine Plan for Gender-Responsive Development (1995–2025), the Framework Plan for Women, and the Sustainable Development Goals.

The DENR7 supports the celebration of the month long Women's Month through the different activities dedicated not only for the women but activities which also includes all gender. The passage of the following laws serves as the legal bases for the celebration of National Women's Month:

<u>Proclamation No. 224 s. 1988</u>, "Declaring the First Week of March of Every Year as Women's Week and March 8, 1988, and Every Year Thereafter as Women's Rights and International Peace Day." Signed by former President Corazon C. Aquino on March 1, 1988, it affirmed our solidarity with the United Nations and recognized Filipino women's contribution to the struggle for national independence, civil liberties, equality, and human rights.

<u>Proclamation No, 227 s. 1988</u>, "Providing for the observance of the Month of March as 'Women's Role in History Month'" Signed by President Aquino on March 17, 1988, reinforced the earlier proclamation by emphasizing the role of Filipino women in the social, cultural, economic and political development throughout our history. It provided for a month-long nationwide observance with appropriate ceremonies and activities to be spearheaded by the Commission.

R.A. 6949 s. 1990, "An Act to Declare March Eight of Every Year as a Working Special Holiday to be Known as National Women's Day" was signed by President Aquino on April 10, 1990. The law further strengthened the impetus for the celebration by declaring every March 8 as a special working holiday and enjoining employees from the government and private sector to participate in activities conducted by their offices.

2023-2024 THEME



The 2024 National Women's Month Celebration aims to capitalize on the recurring theme "WE for gender equality and inclusive society," introduced in 2023. This theme, launched to renew commitment to the advocacy, builds upon the accomplishments under the 2016–2022 theme, "WE Make CHANGE Work for Women." The earlier theme stressed the importance of compassionate and harmonized networks towards gender equality and women's empowerment (GEWE).

The banner for this annual campaign is both a positive affirmation and a call to action. It is a testament to the milestones achieved in closing gender gaps in the country and in gathering more support to the advocacy. In the 2023 Global Gender Gap Index (GGGI) Report by the World Economic Forum (WEF), the Philippines maintains its status as the leading Asian country in narrowing the gender gap. The country has attained 79.1 percent gender parity, securing the 16th position out of 146 countries globally—a rise of three places from its previous ranking. In the East Asia and the Pacific region, the Philippines holds the second spot among its neighboring countries, trailing only behind New Zealand. Notably, it stands as the sole Asian nation within the top twenty, with Singapore following at the 49th position. The Global Gender Gap Index evaluates gender equality and progress across four crucial dimensions: Economic Participation and Opportunity, Educational Attainment, Political Empowerment, and Health and Survival.

The recurring theme also aligns with the <u>Philippine Development Plan 2023-2028</u>, which aims for "deep economic and social transformation to reinvigorate job creation and accelerate poverty reduction by steering the economy back on a high-growth path." The plan also highlights that growth must be inclusive, building an environment that provides equal opportunities to all Filipinos and equipping them with skills to participate fully in an innovative and globally competitive economy.

To improve access of women to basic information on climate change, health emergency and disaster risks and hazard and on effective preparedness and counter measure towards a more resilient community in climate change prone areas. Presentation of climate change was provided to the stakeholders of BDFE of Oboob Mangrove Garden Integrated Ecotourism Conservation and Association (OMAGEICA) and Marikaban Small Fishermen Association MASFA) Of Bantayan Wilderness Area (BIWA) participated by 14 females and 12 males BDFE beneficiaries. Outline of the presentation includes 1.) What is Climate Change, 2.) Impacts of Climate Change, 3.) Emergency situation in the Philippines and 4.) Strategies to adapt and mitigate climate change. Likewise, the benchmarking was to engage women in decision making, planning, and on addressing gender gaps on the drafting of BIWA's Ecotourism Management Plan, of which among other issues raised by the Women and Men stakeholders, is on the access and process of availing the financial assistance for their BDFE, and the necessary permit from the MARINA in the operation of their floating cottages. Hence, agreements/resolution/steps/commitments to address such concerns was made.



Women who train in self defense feel empowered. While it is a fundamental human instinct to preserve one's life and safety, self defense allows women to develop confidence. There is nothing more empowering than having the confidence to analyze and find safety during difficult situations. This, according to CENRO Maricor Katada in her opening statement, is the main objective of the activity.

Aireen V. Pinili of CENRO Dumaguete, a black belt and Hakama of Dumaguete Aikido Club, led the basic self defense training/demonstration to DENR Juanas held at the Dumaguete City Nursery and Storage Facility in Camanjac, Dumaguete City. She said the training teaches the Juanas of the physical and mental skills needed to effectively overcome dangerous situations inside and outside of homes, but most especially women forest rangers and those engaged in the enforcement sector.

The basic training focused on knowing the human body's weak points, familiarizing some basic self defense moves such as the groin kick, rotating the wrists to free the hands, dropping low when grabbed behind, and many more.






plan, borrow, invest, and spend wisely while someone who has a low level of financial knowledge has the potential to result in poor financial decisions that will adversely affect their financial condition.

INTRODUCTION

The National Women's Month is celebrated every month of March of every year. The event is aimed at highlighting the contributions of women in nation-building and in society. It is also a clear manifestation of the continuous advocacy for gender equality.

In the Philippines, it started with Proclamation No. 224 series of 1988 "Declaring the First Week of March of Every Year as Women's Week and March 8, 1988 and Every Year Thereafter as Women's Rights and International Peace Day" signed by Former President Corazon C. Aquino signed on March 1, 1988. The proclamation affirmed our solidarity with the United Nations and focused at recognizing Filipino women's contribution in the struggle for national independence, civil liberties, equality and human rights.

It was followed by the issuance of Proclamation No. 227 series of 1988 "Providing for the Observance of the month of March as "Women's Role in History Month". Signed by President Aquino on March 17, 1988, it reinforced the earlier proclamation by emphasizing the role of Filipino women in the social, cultural, economic and political development throughout history. It provided for a month-long nationwide observance with appropriate ceremonies and activities to be spearheaded by the Philippine Commission on Women.

Two (2) years later, Republic Act No. 6949 series of 1990 was issued declaring March Eight of Every Year as a Special Working Holiday to be known as National Women's Day. Signed by President Aquino on April 10, 1990 to further strengthen the impetus for the celebration by declaring March 8 as a special working holiday and enjoining employees from the government and private sector to participate in activities conducted by their offices.

In order to highlight the National Women's Month celebration 2024, DENR PENRO Bohol initiated and spearheaded a number of activities in observance of the month-long celebration, to wit:


After the film showing, the participants were able to share their impressions and learnings in relation to gender, to wit:





The activity started with a lecture on Earthquake Drill which was discussed by Jose Aleto O. Requeron, RN, head TaRSIER 117 and gave emphasis that drill serves as a systematic approach to evaluate the effectiveness, strengthen the preparedness and response capabilities of the employees, test the control, command and communication mechanism and develop every individual the basic things to do in case there is a real emergency like earthquake.



Moreover, after the lecture, the PDRRMO personnel rung twice its alarm bell/buzzer. The first rang signaling the actual earthquake while the second rang signifies that the employees should immediately went out the building following the "Duck, Cover and hold" system and stayed on the open ground in front of the office. Team Leaders of the Disaster Risk Team (DRT) has been dispatched ensuring the safety of everyone in the building.


ZUMBA DANCE EVERY FRIDAY



WOMEN'S MONTH ACTIVITIES





"I am a woman; I can and I will." The tagline speaks with confidence by the participants of the National Women's Day celebration, a collaborative activity of Olango Island Wildlife Sanctuary and the LGU-Brgy. San Vicente, Olango Island, Lapu-Lapu City, Cebu, with a theme of "Lipunang Patas sa Bagong Pilipinas: Kakayahan ng Kababaihan, Patutunayan!" dated March 20, 2024, at Brgy. San Vicente covered the court.

The mentioned barangay is known for its various established people's organizations that have been helping their families, themselves, and the community develop and survive. Most organizations were made up of women and led by women. Regarding the activity, six (6) groups were able to participate, namely the Olango Island Eco-Tour Association (OIETA), San Vicente Kababayen-an (SVK), San Vicente Fisherfolk Association Inc. (SVFAI), Ako Babaye, Urban Poor, Task Force Survey, including representatives from Sangguniang Kabata-an councils, barangay officials, and staff. They may be different groups, but there is one thing that makes them common, and that is their goal of empowering women. The organizers chose them as the highlight of the activity, as indeed their efforts in reaching the social functioning of their family, their members, and others were evident. Honoring the realm of lipunang patas, the activity is not limited to women, other genders were able to participate as well. Indeed, this activity advocates for a just, humane, and empowering society, especially for women and children.

Anti-Violence Against Women and Their Children (VAWC) Act, or Republic Act No. 9262, was maneuvered by Ms. Devine Grace P. Jumao-as, a registered social worker and OIWS staff. Through the PowerPoint presentation, she was able to discuss the policy instruments for the protection of women and the common underlying principles of women's laws, as well as the important terms such as the different types of abuse (physical, sexual, economic, psychological, and emotional) and the technical definition of children and women according to this act. She first discussed those terms to assist the initial realization, familiarization, and understanding of the participants. She then proceeded to discuss the Acts of Violence Against Women and Their Children as a crime, the penalties, and the difference between this Republic Act and other laws that protect women. To make it engaging, the speaker asked the participants related questions and also gave situations that were answered by not a VAWC case or a VAWC case.



COOKING CONTEST AND AN ECO-BAG HAND SEWING CONTEST

The organizers implemented a cooking contest and an eco-bag hand sewing contest. The organizers carefully decided to implement these contests at the same time to make the most of the time. For the cooking contest, there were six (6) participating groups, namely the Olango Island Eco-Tour Association (OIETA), San Vicente Kababayen-an (SVK), San Vicente Fisherfolk Association Inc. (SVFAI), Ako Babaye, Urban Poor, and Task Force Survey. Prior to the activity, the groups were informed that crab and shells should be the main meat of their dish, given that one of the main resources that we can get from the island are edible crabs and shells. All ingredients are provided by the organizers, and they also invited three (3) judges: brgy counselor Mr. Cyrus P. Eyas, brgy staff Mrs. Roselle Andales, and OIWS staff Ms. Marivic Grejaldo. They are given one hour and thirty minutes to complete their dish. Following the criteria, the OIETA and SVK ranked as the 1st placer, the Task Force Survey as the 2nd placer, and Urban Poor as the 3rd placer. All winners received a monetary prize worth 1000.00 PHP and kitchen utensils, while the participating groups received 1000.00 PHP. For the eco-bag hand sewing contest, the needed materials were provided by the organizers. The winner received a monetary prize, groceries, and her own handmade apron. Those other participants received a prize, which was their own handmade apron.





CULMINATING ACTIVITY

For this celebration, the culminating activity was the awarding of winners. The organizers called, one by one, the names of the winners of the implemented activity. They were encouraged to go to the front to receive the prize and for the photo documentation. After the awarding was the closing remarks, led by the Brgy. Captain of brgy. San Vicente, Hon. Edilberta E. Lambojon. She congratulated and gave thanks to all the organizers and participants for their active participation. She then highlighted encouraging motivational messages for women and assured various activities that would help women and children develop.



Prior to the training-orientation proper, a pre-test was also given to the participants to measure their level of knowledge and awareness.

A total of thirty-five (35) PENRO-Siquijor Personnel (Permanent, Job Order and Youth/OJTs) joined the training-orientation including the resource person and facilitators, of which sixteen (16) are male and nineteen (19) are female, seven (7) are Youth, had fun learning about the pertinent laws protecting women.

NWMC & IDF - DALAW-TURO (MARCH 21, 2024)

The Dalaw-Turo Program held in celebration of the International Day of Forest on March 21, 2024, at Siquijor Integrated School was a collaborative effort between the school administration, DENR PENRO Siquijor, and the DENR Regional Strategic Communication Initiative Group (RSCIG). Participants of the said activity were the twenty-nine (29) Grade 6 students (9 male, 20 female), Ma'am Leah P. Lagudas (adviser), Sterremae Allego and Manilyn A. Remando from DENR Regional Strategic Communication Initiative Group (RSCIG), DENR PENRO Siquijor personnel.

The aim was to educate students about the importance of forests, environmental conservation, and related government initiatives.



NURSERY ACTIVITIES MARCH 21, 2024 AT LILO-AN NURSERY

In light of the International Day of Forests, PENRO Siquijor organized a special initiative to contribute to reforestation efforts. Recognizing the adverse environmental conditions, particularly the high heat index, which rendered traditional tree planting activities unsuitable, the decision, was made to conduct nursery activities instead. This shift in focus aimed to ensure the optimal survival and growth of tree seedlings despite the challenging weather conditions.

A total of 14 personnel from PENRO Siquijor participated in the activity, comprising 5 females and 9 males. Additionally, two (2) youth/OJTs from Siquijor State College enthusiastically joined the initiative, further enriching the team.

The participants diligently engaged in nursery activities throughout the day, focusing on potting of soil and transplanting seedlings. Despite the scorching heat, their dedication remained unwavering, underscoring their commitment to environmental stewardship.

Specifically, the following tasks were accomplished: A total of 3,000 soil bags were prepared, ensuring a suitable environment for the growth of tree seedlings and 500 seedlings were carefully transplanted into the prepared soil bags, setting the stage for their future development.
